

2 moose wander into Regina

"This has been an increasing happening," Bob Luterbach, a regular walker in the area, said Thursday evening. "I've seen them here maybe four or five times." He said the large animals can be dangerous and he always maintains a safe distance from them.

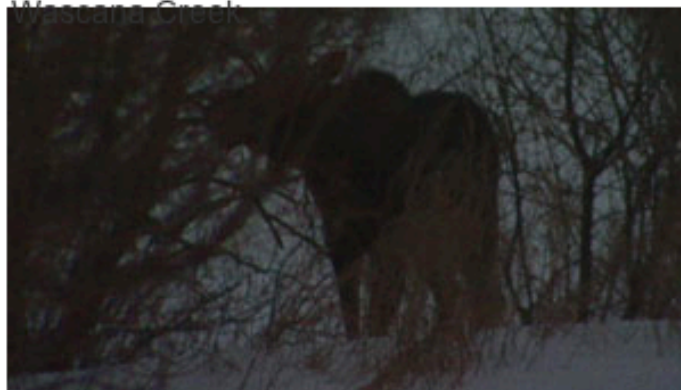
A CBC News videographer spotted the animals in a bushy area south of the local performing arts centre and north of the University of Regina.

When contacted by CBC News, police were not overly concerned as the animals were not near any residential areas and were about 100 metres from the closest roadway.

It is not unusual for wild animals to find their way into the city environs. In recent months, there have been reports of coyotes and cougars in Regina.

Two moose were spotted in Regina on Thursday evening near the Wascana Parkway in the city's southeast.

The animals, barely visible in fading sunlight, appeared to have wandered into the city following the winding route of the frozen Wascana Creek.
